TEASER RAMS

As we look towards autumn, our thoughts start to shift towards preparing for next Spring's lambs. The summer is the perfect time to start planning how we are going to manage the tupping of the flock, and the following lambing period.

One of the ways we can manage a tight lambing period would be to synchronise the ewes. One of the more common ways of doing this would be to vasectomise rams for use as a teaser. Vasectomising rams prevents them from being fertile, but unlike castrating, enables hormonal control of the reproductive tract. The procedure involves removing a portion of the vas deferens (the tubing that transports the sperm) but keeps the testicles intact allowing the production of testosterone.



Teaser rams are used predominantly for the tightening of a lambing period. Putting teasers in with a flock will bring them all into heat, and once removed, and rams put in, most ewes will be served within the first fertility cycle, preventing a long drawn out lambing period.

When selecting a ram to use, there are a few things to consider. Ideally a shearling, not a ram lamb, would be best to use as they are likely to have a higher libido. Being fit and healthy, with good feet and teeth is also important, as they are going to have to work hard!



For the best results, the ewes should be kept out of sight and range of smell, for about a month prior to putting the teaser in. They should be put in with the ewes at a rough ratio of 50:1 (although it is worth bearing in mind that because the ewes are synchronised, when fertile ram is put in a more appropriate ratio would be 20/30:1). The teaser should be left in for 14 days, followed immediately by the fertile ram(s). There will be two peaks of oestrus activity at 18 and 26 days.

We can vasectomise on farm, or at the surgery. The procedure involves a sedation, and taking a small portion of the vas deferens out, to prevent passage of sperm. The process only takes 30-45 minutes. A clean environment is important for the procedure and afterwards, to enable good wound management.

PRACTICAL AI


